

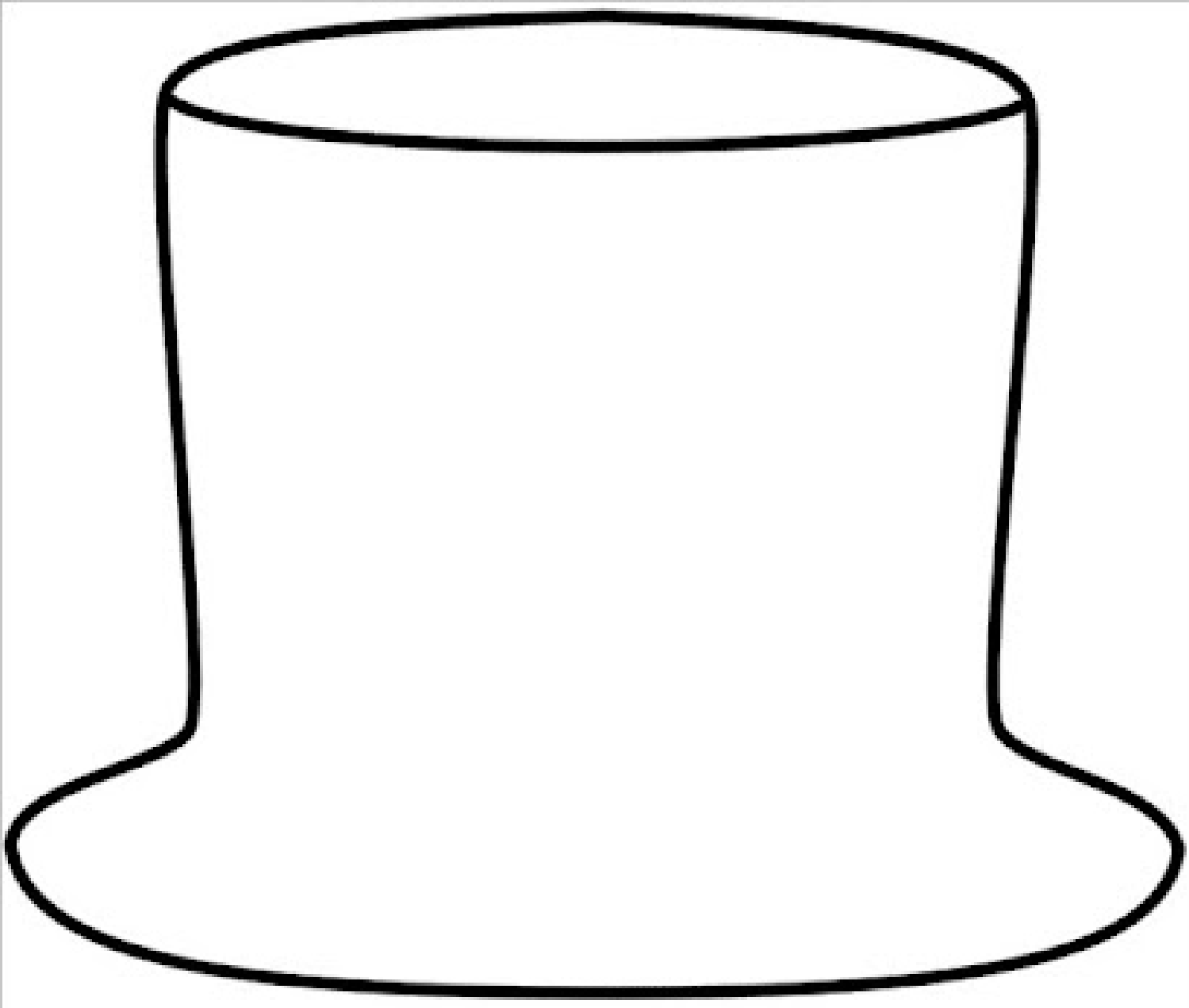

EXPLAIN - Rulers help measure how long an object is.

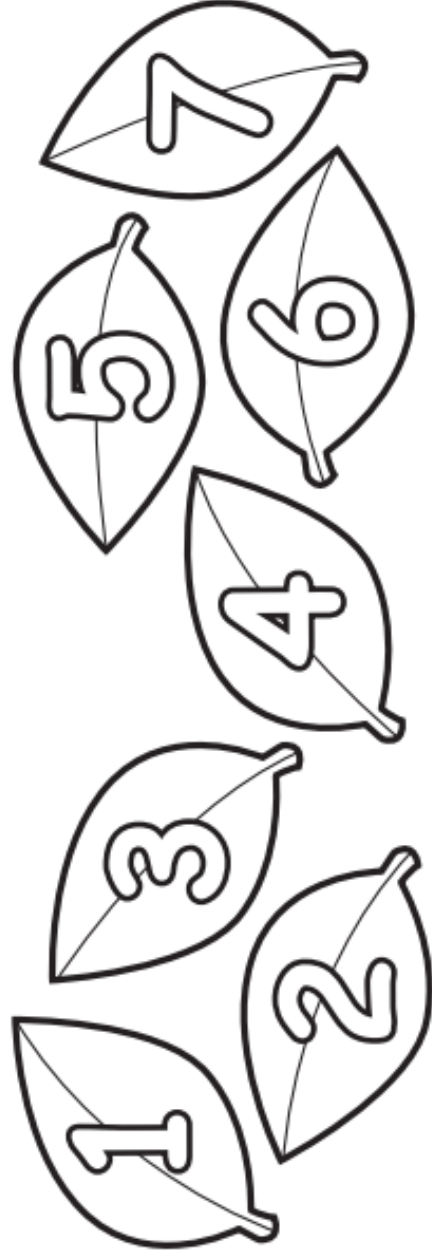
HELP - Cut out pieces.

CHILD - Take the ruler and measure different objects.

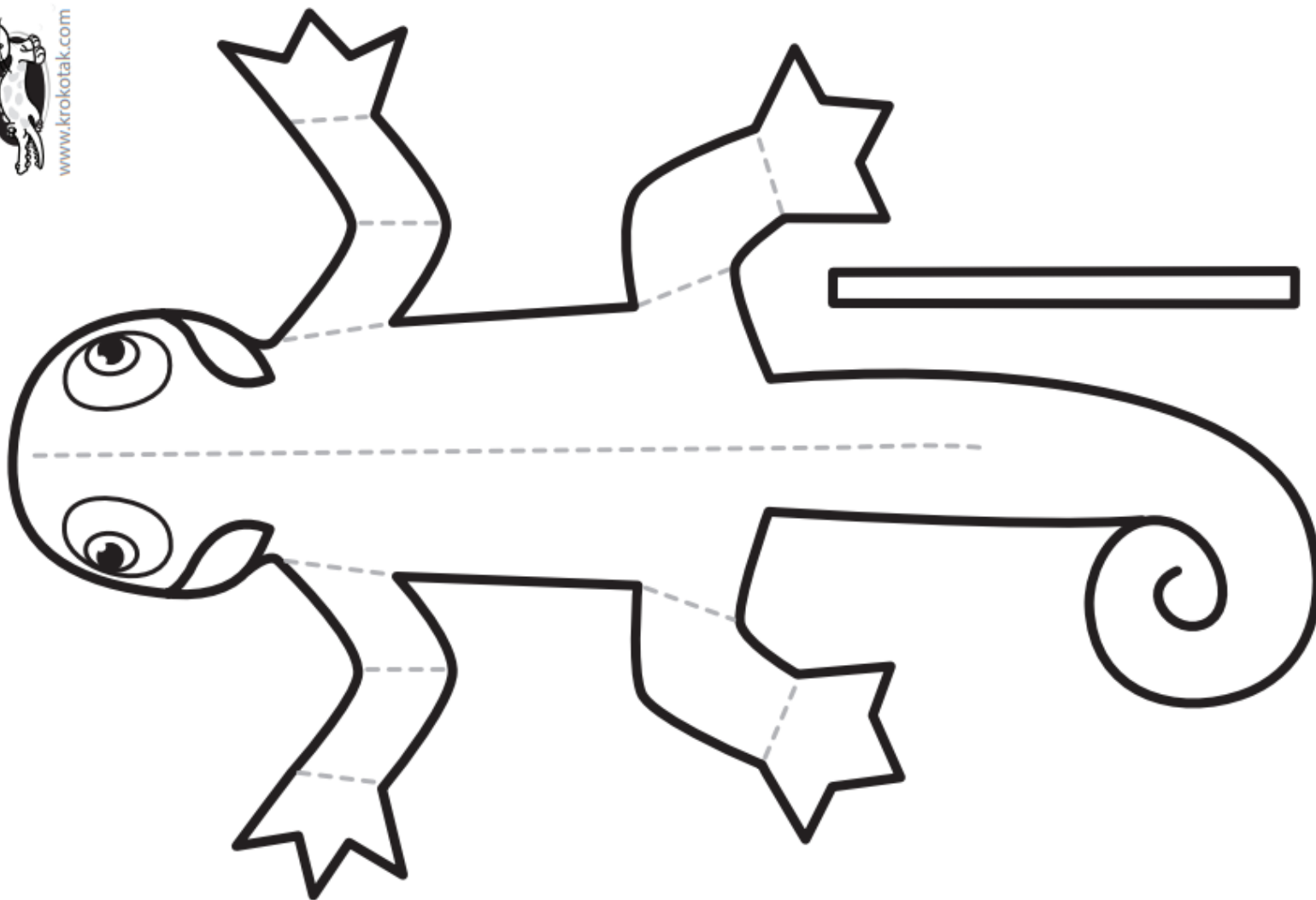

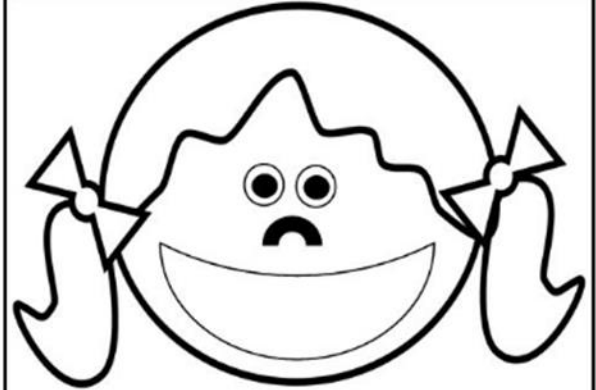
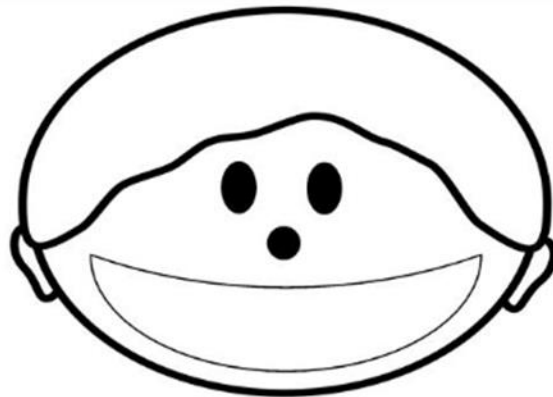
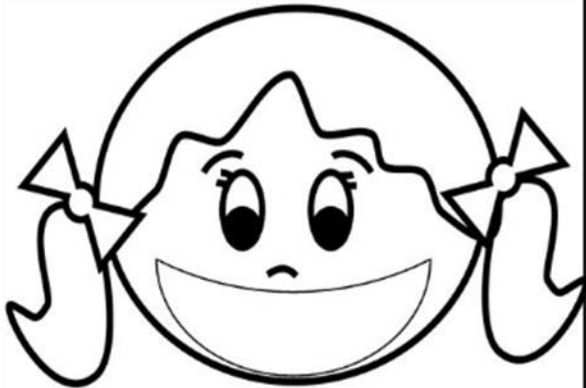




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









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Key and Lock Matching

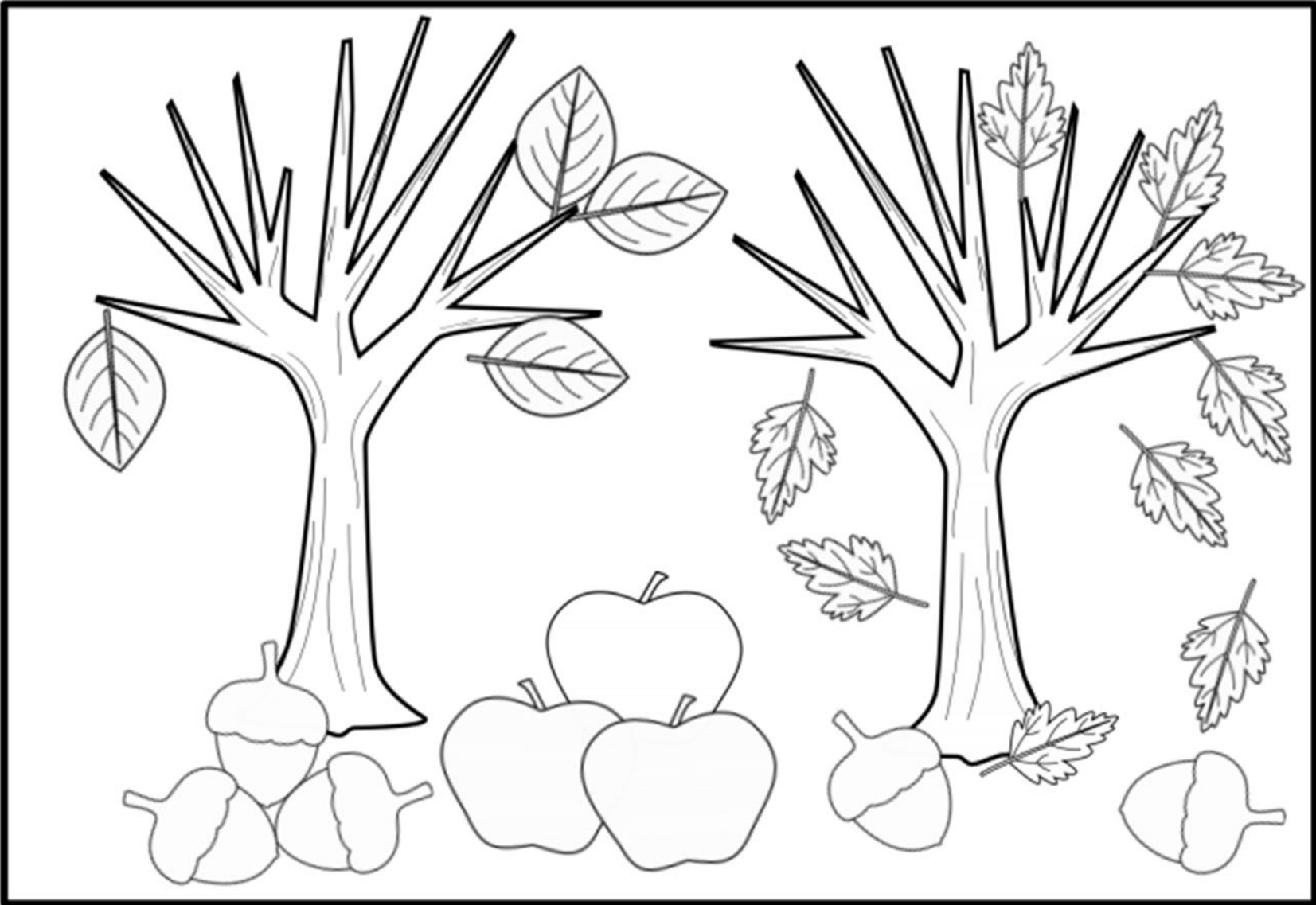
HELP - Color and cut out pieces.
