Hand motion: Stretch your hand and arm way up and say, /a/, /a/, /a/



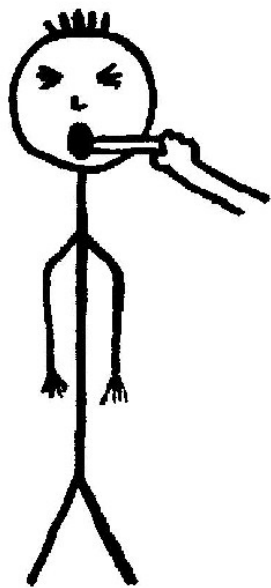
Old Man E is hard of hearing. When he can't hear you, he puts his hand to his ear and says, "/e/, what'd you say Sonny, /e/?"

Hand motion: Put your hand to your ear and say, /e/, /e/, /e/



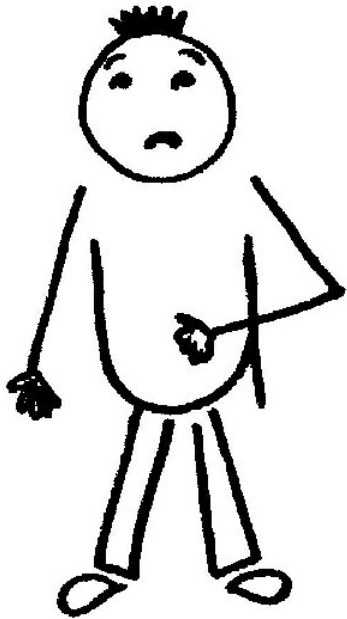
