Red candies or paper circles

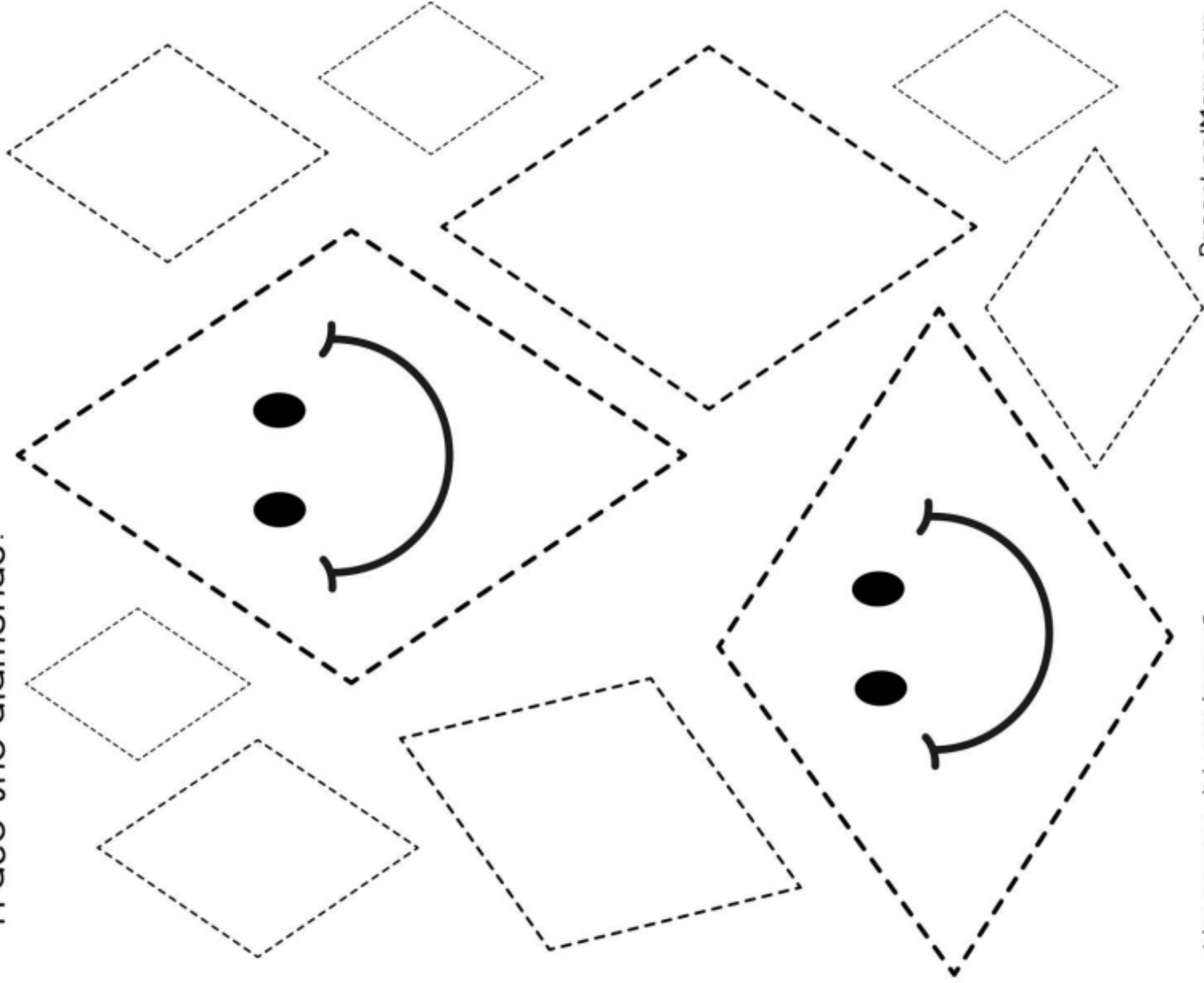


Friday –
