Sunday School Lesson



Create Curiosity:

Act out a scene with a rich, snobby person who won't bend down to help someone who has dropped their crayons. Make a big to-do about being better than that and not stooping to that level... (The rich person can wear a feather boa, jewelry, etc. and the poor person can slip on a tattered flannel shirt.)



Teaching Time: John 13:1-17

Jesus was with His disciples at the Passover Feast. During the supper, Jesus got up, tied a towel around his waste and one by one began to wash the disciples feet. That seems strange to us, but back then it was customary for a servant to wash the feet of guests since the roads were dusty and they walked everywhere back then and usually wore sandals. Today, we might take someone's coat and bags as they enter.

Jesus showed by example that they should love and serve one another selflessly, just as He has done for them.



Craft Corner:

Provide a paper plate and simple feet cutout (provided). They should color the inner section of the plate blue, like water. They should glue the feet on top and add a small piece of rag. (Purchase a dollar store rag and cut it into small pieces.)
